RESULTS


NUMBER OF CITIES

The grant required data from 4 cities. Instead, CivicPro built a system covering 11 local governments.



PERSONALIZED ALERTS

CivicPro's alerts are personalized to each user's interests - helping them discover the time and place of relevant public meetings.



AUTOMATIC POLICY TAGGING

CivicPro can prioritize legislation by issue area. Instead of burying assorted legislation across documents, CivicPro's software instantly recognizes legislation by subject matter and highlights it.

ENGAGEMENT

CivicPro launched a robust engagement process soliciting feedback to ensure the platform could meet local needs. Throughout, CivicPro combined its technical expertise with the experiences of users on the ground, including a cohort of leading non-profit advocacy groups.

RESIDENT SURVEYS

- Surveyed residents from every ZIP Code in Miami-Dade County:
 - 70% self-identified as Black and/or Hispanic.
 - 36% had college degrees.
 - 50% earned less than \$49k per year.
 - 50% were renters rather than homeowners.
 - 65% had lived in the county for over 10 years.

Hosted design testing with residents to develop the user experience.

BETA-TESTING WITH EXPERT ADVOCATES

Recruited a cohort of leading non-profits for early feedback to validate benefits for advocates.

FUTURE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Roundtables with news media, affordable housing advocates, and climate change advocates.
- Deep dive into advocacy impacts in specific policy area.
- Explore benefits of machine learning summaries of legislation to aid less knowledgeable users.
- Find community partners to gauge interest in expanding to new metros.

ALERTS

AUDIENCE 1:

RESIDENTS + NON-PROFIT ADVOCATES

Alerts for individual pieces of legislation tied to user interests simplifies advocacy with cities and allows non-profits to connect volunteers to grassroots efforts.

AUDIENCE 2:

NEWS MEDIA + JOURNALISTS

Alerts for individual pieces of legislation is helpful but not critical.

TRENDS

AUDIENCE 1:

RESIDENTS + NON-PROFIT ADVOCATES

CivicPro can uncover cutting-edge insights about government behavior but this had less immediate impact on advocacy already underway.

AUDIENCE 2:

NEWS MEDIA + JOURNALISTS

Reporters have shown interest in CivicPro's unique trend data, connecting specific policy topics and local governments' behavior.

OPPORTUNITIES

SHARE BENEFITS FOR SPECIFIC GROUPS

Due to demand in Miami, CivicPro is seeking host partners for a series of roundtables with existing institutional users to share best practices in using the alerts system to benefit the following sectors:

- Affordable Housing Advocacy
- Climate Change Advocacy
- News Media

Members of the press have voiced interest in convening such a roundtable, with one newsroom already committed. With additional resources, CivicPro could also do a deep dive into the software's benefits for institutional users. For example, nonprofits have stated that CivicPro helps them tie volunteers into their advocacy. Focusing on specific groups' practices would provide greater insight into the software's impacts on critical issues.

MEET DEMAND TO EXPAND IN NEW METROS

News media have expressed a desire to expand CivicPro's alerts and trend data to additional cities to regain some of the local government coverage lost due to shrinking press staff. To validate this demand, CivicPro is seeking introductions to non-profits in other Knight Cities and metropolitan areas throughout Florida, such as Palm Beach, Leon, Orange, and Pinellas counties.

CLARIFY LEGISLATION WITH A.I.

Outside the grant, CivicPro used artificial intelligence (A.I.) to simplify technical government notices into plain english. Already, CivicPro can automatically generate shorter, clearer sentences with accuracy. However, to actually improve local institutions' ability to engage and inform their communities, CivicPro is seeking resources and testing partners to refine the user experience.
